Resolution No. 2023- 65

A RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS AND HIGHWAY (DPWH), THROUGH ITS DISTRICT ENGINEER, ENGR. ACHILLES B. PIMENTEL, TO FUND AND IMPLEMENT THE INSTALLATION OF SOLAR STREET LIGHTS (INSTALLATION OF SOLAR STREET LIGHTS ALONG BUTUAN CITY – CAGAYAN DE ORO CITY – ILIGAN CITY ROAD) AT BARANGAYS IGPIT, TABOC, POBLACION, BONBON AND LUYONGBONBON, OPOL, MISAMIS ORIENTAL, UNDER THE PROGRAM TITLE SPECIAL ROAD FUND

WHEREAS, Section 16 (a) of the Local Government Code of 1991 states that every local government unit shall exercise the powers expressly granted, those necessarily implied therefrom, as well as powers necessary, appropriate, or incidental for its efficient and effective governance, and those which are essential to the promotion of the general welfare;

WHEREAS, Section 17 of the Code likewise provides that local government units shall likewise exercise such other powers and discharge such other functions and responsibilities as are necessary, appropriate, or incidental to efficient and effective provisions of the basic services and facilities;

WHEREAS, pursuant to 17 (b) (2) (viii) of the Code, local government units are mandated to provide basic services and facilities such as, but not limited to, infrastructure facilities intended primarily to service the needs of the residents of the municipality and which are funded out of municipal funds including but not limited to, municipal roads and bridges; school buildings and other facilities for public elementary and secondary schools; clinics, health centers and other health facilities necessary to carry out health services; communal irrigation, small water impounding projects and other similar projects; fish ports; artesian wells, spring development, rainwater collectors and water supply systems; seawalls, dikes, drainage and sewerage, and flood control; traffic signals and road signs; and similar facilities;

WHEREAS, Section 447 (a) (5) (v) of the Code states that the Sangguniang Bayan shall regulate the use of streets, avenues, alleys, sidewalks, bridges, parks and other public places and approve the construction, improvement, repair and maintenance of the same; establish bus and vehicle stops and terminals or regulate the use of the same by privately-owned vehicles which serve the public; regulate garages and the operation of conveyances for hire; designate stands to be occupied by public vehicles when not in use; regulate the putting up of signs, signposts, awnings and awning posts on the streets; provide for the lighting, cleaning and sprinkling of streets and public places;
